The South Carolina Police Combat League is sponsoring a series of NRA Sanctioned Police Pistol Combat Tournaments in 2025.

Each Tournament will be offering a variety of different sanctioned NRA Matches. Such matches may include the Production Semi-Automatic Pistol Match, Stock Service Semi-Automatic Pistol Match, Stock Service Revolver Match, and the Off Duty Match (including the new Off-Duty Optic Match). Additionally, an approved hybrid version of the NRA Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol, Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Optic, Open Class Revolver Match will be offered. Some Tournaments will also offer a hybrid version of the NRA Police Shotgun Match. Other events will be posted on the S.C. Police Combat League website at www.scpcl.org.

First Time Shooters

These Tournaments are a great way for you to evaluate your skill level, identify needed training areas, and practice your handgun skills to keep you prepared for the ever-increasing dangers you face on the street and off duty. You do NOT need any fancy gear or guns to start shooting these matches. Just bring your duty handgun, four magazines, holster & magazine pouch. There is nothing to memorize, the course will be announced as you shoot just like the stages during a qualification and fellow officers will gladly help you out. You can even use your stock duty gun to fire the Open Class Division matches to get started and see how challenging and fun these matches are.

Governing Rules: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournaments. All competitors are encouraged to review the current PPC rules. The NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book is available on-line at **ppc.nra.org**.



Eligibility: Open to any eligible law enforcement member as outlined in Police Pistol Combat Rule Section 2.4.

Classification: Competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications, new shooters with no Classification, or those without a Temporary Record Score Book will be registered in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2.

Competitors may check their current NRA Classification at LEcompetitions.nra.org.

Registration: Will be done on-site. Please complete the Registration Form at the end of this announcement and bring it with you to speed your registration process.

All competitors MUST present the following items during Registration:

- 1. Valid Department or Agency Identification
- 2. Current Classification Card or current Temporary Classification Book unless they have not fired in a PPC Tournament before.

Categories: There will be no categories used in these Tournaments.

Awards: None. Competitor standings will be posted on the S.C. Police Combat League website under the "SCORES" tab.

Locations, Dates & Matches Offered & Match Information: The first Match at **ALL** locations begins at 0900, **except** for the April 13 Low Light Match at the SC Criminal Justice Academy. Make sure you arrive in time to check in and get your gear together.

- Depending on the date and location there MAY be up to four matches offered, with three being the norm. The table below lists the type of Match being fired each Match and the order being fired.
- For Duty Gun Division Matches you may fire <u>either</u> your Stock Service Semi-Automatic Pistol, Production Semi-Automatic Pistol, Stock Service Revolver, or any type of approved Off-Duty firearm.
- For Open Class Division Matches you may fire either your Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol or your Open Class Revolver.
- Where the same type of Match is offered twice you can fire the Match again using <u>another type</u> firearm from that Division. For instance, if the first and second Match are both listed as Open Class Division Matches, you could fire your Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol in the first Match and your Open Class Division Revolver in the second Match or vice versa.

With permission of the Tournament Director you can fire the second Match with the same type handgun for <u>practice only</u> with the score not being listed on the Final Bulletin or for Awards or sent to NRA [PPC Rules only allow one Score for Record per match during a Tournament].

Targets: Official NRA B-27 targets and repair centers will be used.

Scoring: Competitor scoring will be used. Pursuant to PPC Rule 14.2, **NO** competitor will score their own target **NOR** may a competitor score the targets of a competitor from their same agency. If this cannot be avoided due to the Match's makeup contact a Match Official to score the targets. PPC Rules prohibit the use of plug-type scoring gauges. Overlays and Eagle Eyes may be used by competitors.

Score cards must be signed and are FINAL once signed so **PLEASE** double check the recorded hits and values BEFORE signing.

Courses of Fire: Due to the shortage and inflated costs of ammunition, the South Carolina Police Combat League has modified the traditional **Open Class Division course of fire for the 2025 season**. The modified course of fire is outlined below.

Time Limits: Time Limits will be announced for each stage or match. Time will start with loaded gun in the holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun until the command to commence firing is given.

Firing Method: Matches or stages designated as double action must be fired double action. Matches or stages designated as single action may be fired either single or double action. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action except at the 50-yard line.

Loading: To force reloading under time constraints and magazines are loaded with a maximum of 6 rounds. There is no limit on the number of magazines or speed loaders you have but after initial loading all ammunition used during the firing of a stage or string MUST be on your person.

SCPCL Shotgun Match

The SCPCL Shotgun Match uses Stages 3 and 4 of the NRA National Police Shooting Championships Police Shotgun Match 20 as found in the NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book. The stages are listed as Stage 1 & 2 below.

Firearm: Shotgun must be factory manufactured, 12 gauge, barrel length not to exceed 22 1/4 inches, metallic sights only, and no modifications. Barrel is to be cylinder or improved cylinder bore; constriction at the choke may not exceed 0.0149. Removable Chokes may be used. Shotgun barrels may checked for choke and inspected. All safety devices provided by the manufacturer must function as designed.

Sling: Shotgun may be equipped with a sling but it cannot have sling cuffs or other devises that attach to the arm. Slings may only be used in Stage 4.

Ammunition: Must be 12-gauge 1 ounce rifled slugs. Ammunition may be inspected and a sample shell may be required for disassembly and examination. Reloaded or sabot ammunition will not be allowed.

Scoring Values: Hits are scored using the B-27 target X, 10, 9, 8, and 7 Point face value scoring rings.

Stage 1: 25 yards, from the shoulder, 5 rifled slugs fired at one B-27 target in 10 seconds. Gun must be held under the arm until the targets start to turn.

Stage 2: 50 yards, from the shoulder, from either the kneeling or standing position, 5 rifled slugs fired at one B-27 target in 60 seconds. Gun stock <u>must</u> be held under the arm until targets start to turn. Sling <u>may</u> be used but cannot be wrapped around the arm or otherwise attached in any manner to the competitor's body <u>until</u> after the targets start to turn.

Firearm / Caliber: Pistols meeting the specifications for Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistols in Section 3.3,1 may be equipped with an Approved non-magnified optic suitable for duty use.

The Duty Optic must be listed as Approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions in Police Pistol Combat Bullet 19.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website.

All Other Specifications are the same as for Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistols

NOTE: Open Class Duty Optic Pistol match results are not eligible for use in determining the South Carolina Governor's Twenty

Please take note that the NRA has made it clear that NO matter what APPROVED Replacement Sight is used, the sights MUST keep a Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact, not a competition set up, such as a Neck Hold, Shoulder Hold, or Head Hold.

A Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact sight set up requires the sights to be aligned on the X Ring/Center Mass to obtain a Hit in the X Ring/Center Mass area.

Pistols with competition sight set ups will be Disqualified, even if having already been used to fire a Match. Competitors may be required to allow their pistol to be test fired, or checked with a laser boresight to check the sight set up.

PRODUCTION PISTOLS and DISTINGUISHED PRODUCTION PISTOLS

Rule 3.10

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, the following specifications apply for Production Pistols.

Firearm / Caliber: Approved Pistols for this Division are listed in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website. To be considered for approval the pistol must be a mass produced center-fire semi-automatic pistol made for police or military use (at least 1,000 pistols), a stock catalog item that is unmodified from its original factory condition, and have a double, double/single, or striker type action. Double/single actions pistols must have a manual decocking device, or equipped with an automatic decocker that returns the pistol to double action mode when the slide is released. All double/single action and double action pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action.

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, and 3.10, the following specifications apply for Production Duty Optic Pistols.

Firearm / Caliber: Pistols meeting the specifications for Production Pistols in Section 3.10 and are listed as Approved in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14.1 may be equipped with an Approved non-magnified optic suitable for duty use.

The Duty Optic must be listed as Approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions in Police Pistol Combat Bullet 19.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website.

To be considered for approval, Duty Optics must mount <u>without any modification</u> to the handgun as originally manufactured. Swapping the original slide to an aftermarket slide with optic mount cuts is <u>not</u> allowed since the handgun is no longer as originally manufactured.

The pistol should have co-witnessed front and rear sights, but the rear sight may be removed to mount the Duty Optic or to use a Stock Optic Ready Plate.
