These Tournaments are a great way for you to evaluate your skill level, identify needed training areas, improve your qualification scores, and practice your handgun skills to keep you prepared for the ever-increasing dangers you face on the street and off duty.

~ NEW SHOOTERS ~

You do NOT need any fancy gear or guns to start shooting these matches. Just bring your duty handgun, three magazines, holster & magazine pouch. There is nothing to memorize, the course will be announced as you shoot just like the stages during a qualification and fellow officers will gladly help you out. You can even use your stock duty gun to fire the Open Class Division Matches if you have four magazines. This will let you see what the other matches are like and how challenging and fun these matches are.

Matches Offered: We are pleased to offer the Stock Service Semi-Automatic Pistol Match, Production Pistol Match, Production Duty Optic Pistol, Stock Service Revolver Match, Distinguished Production Pistol Match, Distinguished Semi-Automatic Pistol Match, Distinguished Revolver Match, Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Matches, Open Class Revolver Matches and the SCPCL Shotgun Match. Team Matches will also be offered but will be non-fired paper matches so will team scores will not be sent to NRA Law Enforcement Competitions.

Governing Rules: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournament. All competitors are encouraged to review the current PPC rules. The NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book is available on-line at **ppc.nra.org**.



SAFETY: All safety rules of the NRA, SCCJA, and the SCPCL will be enforced. Safety violations will be grounds for removal from the firing line. Major violations can cause disqualification. No alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the South Carolina Criminal Justice Academy property.

Individual Eligibility: Open to any eligible law enforcement member as outlined in Police Pistol Combat Rule Section 2.4. These include active and retired Law Enforcement Officers, and <u>full time</u> Police Firearms Instructors, Transit Police, Penal Institution Guards, Industrial Police which includes Bank Guards and Armored and Express Company Guards, and Military Police. Federal Flight Deck Officers who hold valid certifications are also eligible.

NRA Membership is not required but encouraged. Discounted NRA Membership Forms for Law Enforcement Officers will be available during the Tournament.

Make sure you bring your agency credentials or other paperwork showing your eligibility with you to show when you check in.

Team Eligibility: Team Matches will be Paper Matches. Teams will consist of two or four firing members and a Team Captain. The Team Captain may be a competing member of the team. Police Pistol Combat Rule 2.8 requires that all team members <u>must be from the same agency</u>. Membership can include officers retired from the agency if they are not now employed by another eligible agency. Eligible Military competitors who are also regular full time law enforcement, industrial law enforcement, or reserve/auxiliary law enforcement must sign up with other members <u>from their law enforcement agency</u>. No "pick-up" teams are allowed.

Registration: You may register on-site but <u>Pre-Registration is highly recommended</u> to be certain of a slot. <u>All</u> Individual Registrations must be received by 0800 on Thursday May 15th, 2024.

To register please complete the Competitor Registration Form found at the end of this announcement and follow the submission instructions listed.

Classification: Individual competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications and new shooters with no Classification or those without a Temporary Record Score Book will fire in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2. Competitors may check their current NRA Classification at **LEcompetitions.nra.org.**



Teams will not be divided by Class for Award purposes.

Teams must be declared Friday and Saturday morning prior to the commencement of the Open Class Division Matches.

Relay Requests: Please indicate your Relay choice on your entry card. We cannot guarantee a Relay request, but we will attempt to accommodate all requests. All matches will be shot straight through. Firing will commence promptly at 8:30am. *Please be on time*.

Tournament Fees: Entry fees will be collected on the day of the Tournament with payment made in cash or by check. Where applicable, fees include NRA Match Fees

Shooters are also encouraged to bring a competitor who has never competed in the Palmetto State Regional before. For those persons bringing a new competitor, both the sponsor and the new attendee will **get ten dollars off of the package price**. Let us know when you register at the range and the credit will be given. If you have Pre- Registered, the fees will be adjusted accordingly and refunded.

Firearm Awards: Only one gun per competitor will be awarded. Your averaged Classification will determine Class Awards for Open Class 3000 Aggregate and Distinguished 1800 Aggregate. Individual Class winners of the firearms will drop to the next eligible shooter if the Class winner has won a gun in another match. If a competitor wins a gun as the Open Class 3000 Aggregate and then wins another in, for example, the Distinguished 1800 Aggregate, the firearm in the Distinguished 1800 Aggregate will be awarded to the number two shooter in that Class. This way a person need not place first in their Class to win a firearm.

Firearms Winners:

<u>Out of State Winners</u>: By federal law, firearms must be shipped to your local FFL dealer for ultimate transfer to you. Firearms will be shipped upon receipt of a valid, signed in ink, copy of your dealers FFL license and payment for shipping, which is your responsibility.

<u>In State Winners</u>: Federal and state law require a NICS background check to approve the transfer of a firearm to you, before you receive your firearm. Winners will be presented a certificate to present to participating FFL to receive firearms. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Saturday Night Barbeque: Will begin at 6:00 pm with the Awards Presentation following the meal. For those shooters who win more than one match, cash, trophies and other awards may be given.

Area Attractions: There are numerous attractions in the area to include the South Carolina State Capital Grounds, Riverbanks Zoo and Gardens and the State Museum.

Targets: Official NRA B-27 Targets will be used.

Scoring: Competitor scoring will be used by passing your scorecards to the competitor on your right who will score the targets of the competitor to their left. Pursuant to PPC Rule 14.2, **NO** competitor will score their own target **NOR** may a competitor score the targets of a competitor from their same agency. If this cannot be avoided due to the Relay's makeup contact a Match Official to score the targets.

PPC Rules prohibit the use of plug-type scoring gauges. Overlays and Eagle Eyes may be used by competitors.

Score Cards: All score cards <u>must</u> be signed and are FINAL once signed so **PLEASE** double check the recorded hits and values BEFORE signing. Once a score card is signed and turned in, <u>only</u> a Match Official can alter the card and will initial the change.

Sighting Shots: No sighting shots are allowed.

Course of Fire Information:

Time Limits: Time Limits will be announced for each stage or match. Time will start with loaded gun in the holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun until the command to commence firing is given.

Firing Method: Matches or stages designated as double action must be fired double action. Matches or stages designated as single action may be fired either single or double action. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action except at the 50 yard line.

Loading: To force reloading under time constraints and magazines are loaded with a maximum of 6 rounds. There is no limit on the number of magazines or speedloaders you have but after initial loading all ammunition used during the firing of a stage or string MUST be on your person.

SCPCL Shotgun Match

The SCPCL Shotgun Match uses Stages 3 and 4 of the NRA National Police Shooting Championships Shotgun Match 20 as found in the NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book. The stages are listed as Stage 1 & 2 below.

Firearm: The shotgun must be factory manufactured, 12-gauge, barrel length not to exceed 22 1/4 inches, metallic sights only, and no modifications. Barrel is to be cylinder or improved cylinder bore; constriction at the choke may not exceed 0.0149. Removable Chokes may be used. Shotgun barrels may be checked for choke and inspected. All safety devices provided by the manufacturer must function as designed.

Sling: The shotgun may be equipped with a sling, but it cannot have sling cuffs or other devises that attach to the arm. Slings may only be used in Stage 2.

Ammunition: Must be 12-gauge 1-ounce rifled slugs. Ammunition may be inspected, and a sample shell may be required for disassembly and examination. Reloaded or sabot ammunition will not be allowed.

Scoring Values: Hits are scored using the B-27 target X, 10-, 9-, 8-, and 7-Point face value scoring rings.

- **Stage 1:** 25 yards, from the shoulder, 5 rifled slugs fired at one B-27 target in 10 seconds. Gun must be held under the arm until the targets start to turn.
- **Stage 4:** 50 yards, from the shoulder, from either the kneeling or standing position, 5 rifled slugs fired at one B-27 target in 60 seconds. Gun stock <u>must</u> be held under the arm until targets start to turn. Sling <u>may</u> be used but cannot be wrapped around the arm or otherwise attached in any manner to the competitor's body <u>until after the targets start to turn</u>.

Firearms, Ammunition & Holsters Allowed: Please see NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book Section 3 for Firearm requirements and the *NRA PPC Rule Book Quick View Firearm Matrix* charts reproduced below.

Any questions concerning firearms, ammunition or holsters should be directed to Tournament Officials <u>prior</u> to commencement of that shooter's relay. Where applicable, triggers will be weighed, and ammo inspected prior to match.

APPLIES TO ALL FIREARMS

Rule 3.1

Each competitor is responsible for their firearm and any which may be questionable should be submitted to the Tournament Director, Referee, or 3-Man Jury for decision prior to being used.

All standard safety features of the pistol must operate properly.

With respect to Sections 3.2 through 3.10, and in addition to the firearm specific regulations below, the following features are either Allowed or Prohibited on all firearms.

Action work to make a crisper and/or smoother trigger pull	Allowed
Fixed or adjustable sights	Allowed
Sight Blackening	Allowed
Modification or change of stocks because of the size of a competitor's hand or to facilitate loading	Allowed
Internal modifications that would render the firearm less safe than originally designed by the manufacturer	Prohibited
Any external modifications, except those allowed within each rule	Prohibited
Front sight extending beyond muzzle	Prohibited
Compensators, barrel venting, or barrel porting	Prohibited

Ammunition: No high speed or Magnum ammunition will be allowed. Ammunition must be hand loaded or factory loaded to produce sufficient velocity to pass through the target AND the backer. Shots which do not pass through the target and the backer will be scored as misses.

OPEN CLASS REVOLVER

Rule 3

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, the following specifications apply for Open Class Revolvers.

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, the following specifications apply for Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistols.

Firearm / Caliber: Center-fire pistols of .35 caliber or larger. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action except at the 50 yard line.

OPEN CLASS DUTY OPTIC PISTOLS

Rule 3.3.2

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.3.1, the following specifications apply for Open Class Duty Optic Pistols.

Firearm / Caliber: Pistols meeting the specifications for Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistols in Section 3.3,1 may be equipped with an Approved non-magnified optic suitable for duty use.

The Duty Optic must be listed as Approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions in Police Pistol Combat Bullet 19.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website.

All Other Specifications are the same as for Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistols

To be considered for approval the pistol must be a mass produced center-fire semi-automatic pistol made for police or military use (at least 1,000 pistols), a stock catalog item that is unmodified from its original factory condition, and have a double, double/single, or striker type action. Double/single actions pistols must have a manual decocking device, or equipped with an automatic decocker that returns the pistol to double action mode when the slide is released. All double/single action and double action pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action.

PRODUCTION DUTY OPTIC PISTOLS

Rule 3.10.

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, and 3.10, the following specifications apply for Production Duty Optic Pistols.

Firearm / Caliber: Pistols meeting the specifications for Production Pistols in Section 3.10 and are listed as Approved in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14.1 may be equipped with an Approved non-magnified optic suitable for duty use.

The Duty Optic must be listed as Approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions in Police Pistol Combat Bullet 19.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website.

To be considered for approval, Duty Optics must mount without any modification to the handgun as originally manufactured. Swapping the original slide to an aftermarket slide with optic mount cuts is not allowed since the handgun is no longer as originally manufactured.

The pistol should have co-witnessed front and rear sights, but the rear sight may be removed to mount the Duty Optic or to use a Stock Optic Ready Plate.

OFF DUTY PRODUCTION DUTY OPTIC PISTOLS

Rule 3.10.2

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, and 3.10.1, the following specifications apply for Off Duty Production Optic Pistols.

Firearm / Caliber: Pistols meeting the specifications in Section 3.10.1 and that are listed as Approved in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14.1 with a maximum Barrel Length of 3.75 inches, may be equipped with a non-magnified duty optic listed as Approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions in Police Pistol Combat Bullet 19.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website.

All Other Specifications are the same as Production Duty Optic Pistols. For Classification purposes, the shooters Production Duty Optic Pistol Classification will be used.

Please take note that the NRA has made it clear that NO matter what APPROVED Replacement Sight is used, the sights MUST keep a Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact, not a competition set up, such as a Neck Hold, Shoulder Hold, or Head Hold.

A Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact sight set up requires the sights to be aligned on the X Ring/Center Mass to obtain a Hit in the X Ring/Center Mass area.

Pistols with competition sight set ups will be Disqualified, even if having already been used to fire a Match. Competitors may be required to allow their pistol to be test fired, or checked with a laser boresight to check the sight set up.


