Course Name: Officer Down Search & Rescue

Course Type: Scenario – **Blind Course**

Start/Stop: Shot Timer / Last Shot - 180 Max Time

Targets: 14 TP-1 Targets

Scoring: TPC - Best 2 Hits on Paper

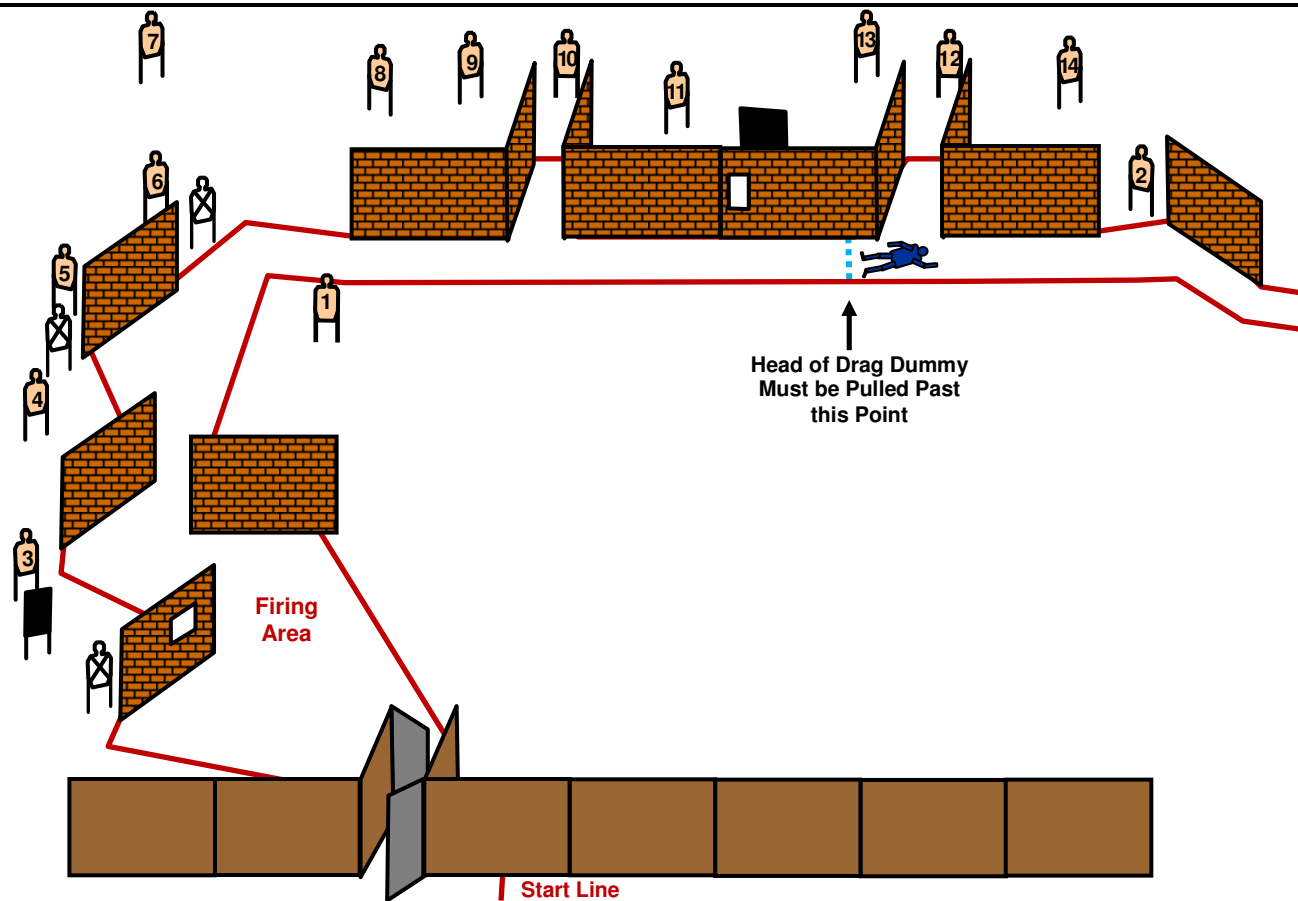
Firearms / Rounds Required: Patrol Rifle = 23 Rounds **MAXIMUM** / Duty Handgun = 5 Rounds

Start Position: Holstered loaded Handgun. Standing with heels on Start Line with loaded Patrol Rifle at Shoulder Ready containing a maximum of 23 rounds. No additional rifle ammunition may be carried.

Course Description: Earlier today you were at the range for a 4 hour Patrol Rifle Up Date class. After cleaning your rifle you began loading your duty magazine when the Range Lieutenant announced that the patrol lieutenant called looking for someone to work 5 hours of fill in overtime for the first part of the oncoming 4 to 2 shift. After you volunteered, the Range Lieutenant said to grab your gear and head out so you could attend Roll Call Briefing. While en route to Roll Call you hear an officer scream “shots fired” and the “I’m hit” over the radio. Communications identifies the officer using the automated radio ID generator, called the officer several times with no response, and then put out an emergency Officer Needs Assistance alert call. They then added that the officer was at the T&E Towing storage lot office to take a report that some narcotics and a shotgun were found in a vehicle towed earlier from a private lot. You realize that you are less than a minute away and respond. After parking outside the gate along the 6’ wood stockade fence that surrounds the lot, you grab your Patrol Rifle and enter the side pedestrian gate to avoid being seen. In your rush to get to the overtime detail you forgot that you had only loaded 23 rounds in your carry patrol Rifle Magazine when the Range Lieutenant told you to grab your gear and go.

On the Start Signal, enter the lot and make your way towards the office and garages while looking for your downed officer. Engage any Threat Targets **AS SEEN**. When you find the downed officer pull him back to cover out of the hallway to where indicated and continue your search to secure the area. Transition to Duty Handgun after firing all rifle rounds using Muzzle Up, Muzzle Down or TAC Sling technique.

NOTES: For each rifle round fired above 23, one Procedural will be applied, the rounds will be scored as Misses and do not count as target engagements. Failure to engage Threat Target AS SEEN is one Procedural.

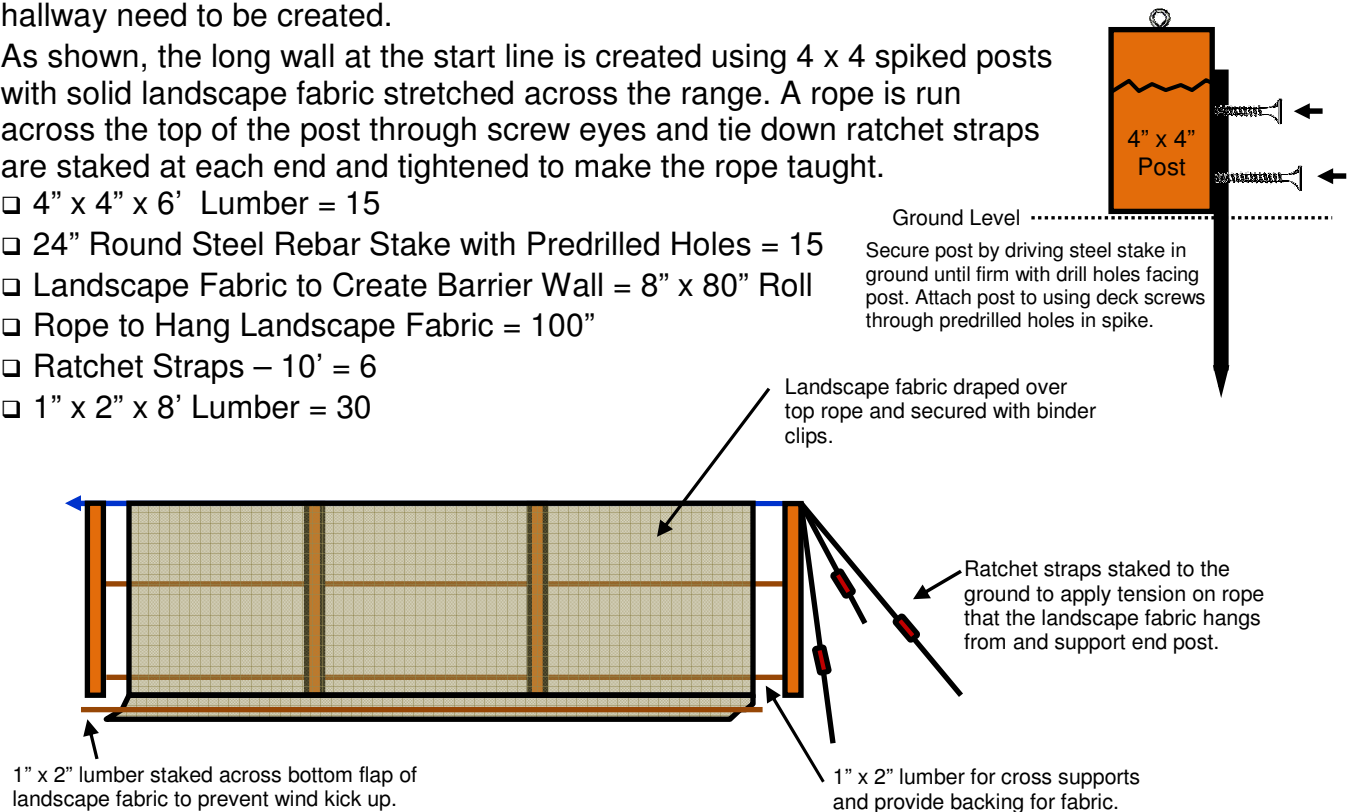
Course Material & Supplies

- ❑ Course of Fire Kit: RO Radio / Shot Timer with Random & Max Time Functions / Timer Spare Batteries / RO Clipboard / Score Sheets / Completed Score Sheet Folder / Staple Gun & Staples / Pens / Markers / Tan & White Target Pastes
- ❑ RO Table & Pop Up Tent for Shelter
- ❑ Competitor Equipment Staging Table = 2
- ❑ Material To Create Firing Area Boundaries
- ❑ TP-1 Full Size Targets = 17 (3 for Non-Threat)
- ❑ TPC Cover Targets = 3
- ❑ Target Stands = 18
- ❑ Target Stand Sticks = 36 Minimum - Various Heights
- ❑ Wall Sections = 13 Full Size
- ❑ 2" x 2" x 8' Lumber For Wall Supports and Cross Braces = 42
- ❑ 1" x 2" x 8' Lumber for firing Area Lines & Target Sticks = 43
- ❑ 2" x 4" x 8' Lumber to Make Door Jams = 5
- ❑ Spikes for Walls, Wall Supports, Target Stands, Firing Area Lines = 120
- ❑ Doors = 2
- ❑ Spring Loaded Door Hinges = 4
- ❑ Door Handles = 3 (1 for Spare)
- ❑ Up Range Visual Barrier Wall to Create Blind Courses

Note: If shooters who have not fired can be kept on a side range or other area where they cannot see down range, the long wall at the start line need not be erected. Only the doors and hallway need to be created.

As shown, the long wall at the start line is created using 4 x 4 spiked posts with solid landscape fabric stretched across the range. A rope is run across the top of the post through screw eyes and tie down ratchet straps are staked at each end and tightened to make the rope taught.

- ❑ 4" x 4" x 6' Lumber = 15
- ❑ 24" Round Steel Rebar Stake with Predrilled Holes = 15
- ❑ Landscape Fabric to Create Barrier Wall = 8" x 80" Roll
- ❑ Rope to Hang Landscape Fabric = 100'
- ❑ Ratchet Straps – 10' = 6
- ❑ 1" x 2" x 8' Lumber = 30
