The Fairfax County Firearms Training Unit invites you to our NRA Law Enforcement Division Regional Police Pistol Combat Tournament on Saturday February 23, 2019.

This Tournament is a great way for you to get some extra duty gun range time, evaluate your skill levels, obtain an NRA Combat Classification, identify needed training areas, meet other officers from the area and help keep you prepared for the ever-increasing dangers you face on the street and off duty.

The Tournament will be offering the NRA Production Semi-Automatic Pistol Match, Stock Service Semi-Automatic Pistol Match, Stock Service Revolver Match, Distinguished Matches to get your first or additional NRA Distinguished Award Points, and the Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol and Open Class Revolver Matches. We will also be running a NON-NRA Duty Rifle Match for fun.

~ First Time Shooters ~

You do NOT need any fancy gear or guns to start shooting these matches. Just bring your duty handgun, four magazines, holster & magazine pouch. There is nothing to memorize, the course will be announced to you as you shoot just like the stages during a qualification and fellow officers will gladly help you out. You can even use your stock duty gun to fire all matches.

**LOCATION:** The Fairfax County Criminal Justice Academy Range located at 3721 Stonecroft Blvd, Chantilly, Virginia 20151. This is a semi-enclosed range with a concrete deck and steel backstop system. The 25 and 50 yard barricades are 2" x 6" lumber that fit into mounts in the floor.

**GOVERNING RULES:** Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournament. All competitors are encouraged to review the current PPC rules. The NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book is available on-line at [ppc.nra.org](http://ppc.nra.org). or use your smart phone camera to scan the Quick Reader Code.



**ELIGIBILITY:** Sorry, but due to facility and liability restrictions, competitors are restricted to Sworn Active and Retired Public Law Enforcement **ONLY**.

Open to any eligible law enforcement member as outlined in Police Pistol Combat Rule Section 2.4. These include active and retired Law Enforcement Officers.

NRA Membership is not required for any NRA competitions but is encouraged. A special law enforcement discount form for NRA Membership and Renewal will be available at check in.

**All competitors** must present the following items at Check-In: Valid Law Enforcement Agency Identification or Retired Credentials and current NRA PPC Classification Card or current completed Temporary Classification Score Book. First time PPC shooters – See the Classification Section below.

**TOURNAMENT FEES:** Entry fees will be collected on the day of the Tournament with payment made in cash or by check. Please note that depending on the Relays you select you may not be able to fire all of the Matches.

*Note: If space is available on a Relay you may sign up on site to fire a Match a second time as a Re-Entry Match, but following PPC Rule 1.8 the score will not be turned into NRA and cannot be used for classification purposes.*

**REGISTRATION:** Advanced Registration is highly recommended as we will only be using 20 target lanes per Relay with those who register in advance having priority squadding over walk-ons. Please see the last page for Advanced Registration instructions. Advance Registrations MUST be received by 1200 hours on Friday, February 15, 2019.

On-site Registration will be available beginning at 0700 the day of the Tournament. Please complete the Registration on the last page and bring it with you to Check-In. Make sure you allow at least 30 minutes to Register and get your gear together prior to your first Relay Start Time.

**CLASSIFICATION:** Competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications and **new shooters** with no Classification or those without a Temporary Record Score Book will fire in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2. Competitors may check their current NRA Classification at [LEcompetitions.nra.org](http://LEcompetitions.nra.org). or use your smart phone camera to scan the Quick Reader Code to the right.



**MATCH & RELAY SCHEDULE:** The first Match will begin at 0800 and we plan on the last Match beginning at 1425 hours. All competitors do NOT have to report at 0800. Please see the Comptitor Registration Form on the last page for Match and Relay times.

**AWARDS:** NRA Regional Trophies for Overall Winners. There may be additional Awards based on availability.

**CONCESSIONS:** None. It is recommended that you bring water and any snacks you may want.

**EQUIPMENT NEEDED / RESTRICTIONS:** Section 3 of the NRA PPC Rule Book governs equipment.

- **New Shooter Equipment Tips:** Just bring your duty pistol, duty holster, belt and ammunition pouch with at least 3 magazines or speedloaders.

If you want to shoot the Distinguished or Open Division Matches you will need a minimum of 4 magazines or speedloaders.

You should bring a pencil or mechanical pencil for completing scorecards, extra ammunition, bag for your gear, like a patrol or shooting bag, small calculator or calculator application on your phone and a ball cap.

- **Ear Protection is Mandatory:** Since this is a semi-covered range with concrete floors, all sounds reverberate off of the hard surfaces so ear muffs or ear plugs with ear muffs are recommended.
- **Eye Protection is Mandatory:** With the targets that are under cover they receive NO direct lighting from the sun and the overhead ballistic panels on the range reduce available light. As such shooters **should bring CLEAR shooting lenses** in addition to any shaded shooting lenses they usually use. Many past shooters have elected to use amber shooting glasses to increase contrast of the targets and sights. Some shooters have also applied temporary sight white to make their sights stand out better.
- **Cell Phones:** While on the firing line ALL cell phones MUST be turned OFF or turned to silent.

**TARGETS:** NRA B-27 Law Enforcement Targets and Repair Centers will be used.

**SCORING:** Competitor scoring will be used. Pursuant to PPC Rule 14.2, **NO** competitor will score their own target **NOR** may a competitor score the targets of a competitor from their same agency. If this cannot be avoided due to the Relay's makeup contact a Tournament Official to score the targets.



PPC Rules prohibit the use of plug-type scoring gauges. Overlays and Eagle Eyes may be used by competitors. Score cards must be signed and are FINAL once signed so **PLEASE** double check the recorded hits and values BEFORE signing.

#### **COURSES OF FIRE:**

The Range Officer will announce the course of fire, shooting positions and time prior to the start of each Match and Stage. Time will start with a loaded gun in holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun or holster until the command to commence firing is given.

All loading will be with cartridges taken from the competitor's pocket, cartridge belt, mechanical loaders, or special pouch. To force reloading under time restraints, magazine loading is limited to 6 rounds per magazine. There is no limit on the number of magazines you may have but all used during the firing of a stage or string MUST be on your person. It is the competitors' responsibility to have sufficient ammunition in their possession to complete the Match being fired.

A conventional right or left-hand holster must be used. For safety reasons, shoulder, cross draw or holsters which require releasing by insertion of finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Holster cannot be tied down.

Optical Devices: No optical devices other than normal glasses worn for corrective eyesight or Sunglasses will be permitted on the range during Match firing for use by competitors. Use of a mechanical iris, eye patch or eye cover is also prohibited.

Must be capable of chambering and firing .35 caliber or larger ammunition, or FN 5.7 x 28 caliber ammunition. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action.</p>

Firearm / Caliber: <b>Pistols for this Division are approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions and listed on the Law Enforcement Competitions website.</b> To be considered, must be a mass produced center-fire semi-automatic pistol made for police or military use (at least 1,000 pistols), unmodified stock catalog item in its original factory condition, and have a double, double/single, or striker type action. Must be capable of chambering and firing .35 caliber or larger ammunition, or FN 5.7 x 28 caliber ammunition. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action.

Installation of extended magazine releases and slide catches produced by the pistol's manufacturer.	Allowed

Distinguished Production Scores are reported using the NRA Distinguished Production Pistol Scorecard. It requires you to list your Production Pistol information and what page number your pistol is listed on in **NRA Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14-1.**

Prior to shooting, Productions Pistols being used for Production Distinguished matches **MUST** be **INSPECTED** and signed off by a **Tournament Official** as meeting specifications on your scorecard.

Scorecards are later reviewed by **NRA LE Competitions** before your score is validated and recorded.

Please note that you must record your sight information on your NRA Distinguished Production Pistol Scorecard.

So if you have replaced the original sights make sure you know the name, model of the sights, and the page number they are listed on as being approved **FOR YOUR PISTOL** in **Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 16-1.**

The NRA has made it clear that **NO** matter what **APPROVED** Replacement Sight is used, the sights **MUST** keep a Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact, **NOT** a competition set up, such as a Neck Hold, Shoulder Hold, or Head Hold.

**A Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact sight set up** requires the sights to be aligned on the **X Ring/Center Mass** to obtain a Hit in the **X Ring/Center Mass** area.

**Pistols with competition sight set ups will be Disqualified**, even if having already been used to fire a Match. Competitors may be required to allow their pistol to be test fired, or checked with a laser boresighter to check the sight set up.

- Magazine & Loading: Minimum of three 10 round or higher capacity magazines needed. One loaded with 5 Rounds and all others loaded with 10 rounds. Time will be given to load magazines during the course. Tactical Reloading is not allowed during the Course.
- Position Order and Sling Use: Firing Positions must be fired in order. It is your choice whether to use your sling unless directed otherwise.
- Shoulder Ready Position: Toe of Stock in Shoulder Pocket with muzzle depressed at least 45 degrees.
- Place Safety ON, Unload and Lock the Bolt Open after each Stage unless indicated otherwise.
- B-27 Target Scoring: Body Hits = Face Value X, 10, 9, 8 & 7. Head Hits = 10 Points. Extra Hits are taken from the highest value.

Stage 1: 50 Yards ~ **Rifle loaded with a magazine with 5 rounds.** Start Position is standing 6 feet to the REAR and 6 feet to the RIGHT of the your Barricade with Rifle on Primary Shoulder in the Shoulder Ready Position with head upright and off of the stock. Stage 1 is 15 Shots Total, Firing 3 Shots from each position.

On the Start Signal, move forward to the RIGHT side of your Barricade and Fire; 3 Shots Standing Unsupported using your Primary Shoulder; 3 Shots Standing RIGHT Shoulder from the Right side of the Barricade using it for Cover and Support; 3 Shots Standing LEFT Shoulder from the Left side of the Barricade using it for Cover and Support; 3 Shots Kneeling using the Barricade for Cover and Support and 3 Shots Prone. The Time Limit is 70 seconds which includes a Speed Reload.

Stage 2: 25 Yards ~ **Rifle loaded with a magazine with 10 rounds.** Start Position is standing 6 feet to the REAR and 6 feet to the LEFT of the Barricade with Rifle on Support Shoulder in the Shoulder Ready Position with head off of stock. Stage 2 is 10 Shots Total.

On the Start Signal, move forward to the LEFT side of the Barricade and Fire 1 Shot Standing Unsupported using your Support shoulder. Then Fire 2 Shots to the Body and 1 Shot to the Head Standing LEFT Shoulder using the Left side of the Barricade for Cover and Support; 2 Shots to the Body and 1 Shot to the Head Standing RIGHT Shoulder using Right side of the Barricade for Cover and Support; and 2 Shots to the Body and 1 Shot to the Head Kneeling using the Barricade for Cover and Support. The Time limit is 45 seconds.

Stage 3: 25 Yards ~ **Rifle loaded with a magazine with 10 rounds.** Start Position is Standing one full arm's length to the RIGHT side of the Barricade with Rifle Slung Muzzle Down across front of body with Primary Hand on Pistol Grip (*NRA Safety Circle*). Support Hand cannot touch any part of the Rifle. Stage 3 is 6 Shots Total.

On the Start Signal Fire 3 Shots Standing Unsupported and 3 Shots Kneeling Unsupported. The Time Limit is 15 seconds.

When completed ensure your Rifle is ON Safe and leave it Loaded-As-Is. Do NOT reload.

Stage 4: 15 Yards ~ **Rifle already loaded from prior Stage with a magazine with 4 rounds.** Start Position is Standing with Rifle at Shoulder Ready with head off of Stock. Stage 4 is 6 Shots Total.

On the Start Signal Fire 3 Shots Standing and 3 Shots Kneeling. The Time Limit is 12 seconds which includes a Speed Reload.

When completed ensure your Rifle is ON Safe and leave it Loaded-As-Is. Do NOT reload.

Stage 5: 15 Yards ~ **Rifle Loaded from prior Stage with 8 Rounds.** Rifle Slung in NRA Safety Circle Position with Primary Hand on Pistol Grip. Support Hand cannot touch any part of the Rifle. Stage 5 is 3 Shots Total.

On the Start Signal Fire Firing 2 Shots to the Body and 1 Shot to the Head in 8 seconds.

When completed ensure your Rifle is ON Safe and leave it Loaded-As-Is. Do NOT Reload.

Stage 6: 7 Yards ~ **Rifle Loaded from prior Stage with 5 Rounds.** Make sure your last magazine is loaded with at least 5 rounds. Start Position is Standing with Rifle at Shoulder Ready with Head off of Stock. Stage 6 is 6 Shots Total.

On the Start Signal Fire 2 Shots to the Body & 1 Shot to the Head and IMMEDIATELY repeat the drill for a total of 6 Shots. The Time Limit is 15 seconds which includes a Speed Reload.

When completed ensure your Rifle is ON Safe and leave it Loaded-As-Is. Do NOT Reload.

Stage 7: 7 Yards ~ **Rifle Loaded from prior Stage.** Start Position is Standing with Rifle at Shoulder Ready with Head off of Stock. Stage 7 is 4 Shots Total.

On the Start Signal Fire 2 Shots Standing in 3 Seconds. This will be repeated one additional time for a total of 4 Shots.
