The State Championship Tournament will feature the; NRA Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol and Revolver Matches, the NRA Stock Service Semi-Automatic Pistol, Production Pistol, and Stock Service Revolver Duty Gun Matches, and the NRA Distinguished Revolver and Semi-Automatic Pistol Matches.

These matches are a great way for you to train, evaluate your skill level, get some practice, have fun, and hone your handgun skills to keep you prepared for the ever-increasing dangers you face on the street and off duty.

NEW SHOOTERS- you DO NOT NEED an Open Class Gun to shoot any of these matches or any fancy gear. Just bring your duty handgun, four magazines, holster & magazine pouch and you can shoot. There is nothing to memorize, the Range Officer will announce the course as you shoot just like the stages during a qualification and folks will gladly help you out. Driving Directions: From I-5 either North or South bound take Exit # 206 172 ST NE (Highway 531 West) Travel approx. 6 miles west (over rail road tracks, past Lakewood High School) to stop sign at intersection of 172NE & 531 West. Turn right travel another 2 miles. Marysville Rifle Club will be on the right. This is a private club with a gate. The gate will be opened between 08:00 & 08:30 on Friday 7/19/2019 but should be open Saturday and Sunday. Shooting cannot begin until 10:00 per club rules.

Range Facilities: The PPC Range is in Bay 9 of the Action Bays. Enter the main gate and make a right turn drive past the club house and Trap Range and through the gate and up the hill stay to the right and go to the end of the road. Parking will be in the front half of Bay 9. The back half of Bay 9 has 14 lanes with air operated turning targets. Camping is available on MRC property either in the clubhouse parking lot or thru the other gate and up the hill past the Indoor Range. Rest room facilities will be available in side the Indoor Range and inside the Club House. Port-a-potties are also positioned about the area.

Weather: The weather at MRC is usually in the mid-80s with a chance of rain. Sun-block is highly recommended SPF-30 or higher)

Lodging & Area Attractions: It is the competitor's responsibility to make arrangements for overnight lodging.

Food: Lunch items will be available for purchase from about 12:00 to 1:00 PM for a reasonable price on Friday, Sat, Sun (Bread, lunch meat, cheese, condiments, chips and soda pop and water. On Saturday evening an awards banquet will be held at a location yet to be determined. The competitor's meal will be included in the entry fees. Guests must pay for their own food.

Alcohol: Alcoholic beverages may be consumed on Marysville Rifle Club **AFTER the close of shooting each day. Violations will result in DISQUALIFICATION.**

Smoking: Not permitted on the firing line or inside any buildings.

Pets: No dogs, cats or other domestic animals are allowed on MRC property, Except on duty K-9.

Governing Rules: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournament. All competitors are encouraged to review the current PPC rules. The NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book is available on-line at ppc.nra.org or use your smart phone camera to scan this Quick Reader Code ~ no special app or software is required. If viewing on your, Press the CTRL Key and click your cursor on it to go to the website.



Eligibility: Open to any individual member of the NRA that is eligible to compete under rule 2.4 of the current NRA Police Combat Rule Book. NRA Membership is not required for any NRA competitions but is encouraged. A special law enforcement discount form for NRA Membership and Renewal will be available at check in. All competitors must be regular, reserve, or retired members of a recognized Law Enforcement or Military agency per rule 2.4. Identification to support law enforcement or Military Police status must be available and shown on demand of Tournament Officials. NRA or SFC card must be presented upon request. There will be guest matches separate from the Police Program

Shooting Times: Shooting will begin at 10:00 AM on all three days

Registration: Anyone wishing to compete must be registered prior to Saturday 7/20/2019.

- Registration closes at 10:00 on Friday 7/19/2019 for the Special Matches and 9:00AM on Saturday 7/20/2019 for the Revolver & Semi-Auto Matches.
- Registration must be made using the “pre-entry form” attached to this program and accompanied by a check or money order in US funds made payable to MRC PPC.
- A NRA SR-500 Form will be completed by each competitor on the day of the first match.

Other Matches: Other matches may be fired depending on time limitations such as a guest match, warm up match, duty gun match. Match fees and courses of fire will be posted at the range on the day of the match. The entry fee for the warm up match & duty gun match will be \$ 5.00 unless the score for that match is being submitted to the NRA then it will be \$ 7.00. Of that money \$ 1.00 will go to the WSPPA, \$ 1.00 will go to the PPC range Improvement fund and \$ 3.00 will go to the award pool for that match. If this is the only match a competitor enters then \$ 1.00 will go to the WSPPA, \$ 2.00 will go to pay the MRC range use fee and the remaining \$ 2.00 will go to the award pool for that match.

Categories: No Categories will be used for this Tournament.

Classification: Competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications and **new shooters** with no Classification or those without a Temporary Record Score Book will fire in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2.

For Awards Purposes, if there are fewer than 5 competitors in a Class, they may be combined with the competitors in the next higher Class.

Categories: Categories will not be used at this Tournament.

Challenges: A challenge fee of \$ 1.00 will be charged for each challenge made with procedures following Rule Book Section 16.

Safety Equipment: All competitors and spectators are required to wear eye and ear protection while on or near the range facilities during match firing.

Targets: The approved B-27 target will be used. Hits in the 7, 8, 9, 10, and X scoring areas will count and be scored. See PPC Rule section 14.

Scoring: Competitor scoring will be utilized with Scoring performed each time a target is changed. This means that competitors are responsible for recording all shots and tallying the total scores. Pursuant to PPC Rule 14.2, **NO** competitor will score their own target **NOR** may a competitor score the targets of a competitor from their same agency. If this cannot be avoided due to the Relay's makeup contact a Match Official to score the targets. Please remember that PPC Rules prohibit the use of plug-type scoring gauges. Overlays and Eagle Eyes may be used by competitors.

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that their scorecards are completed, signed and turned into the collecting Match Official. Once the scorecard is signed, the value of shots recorded on the card is final and cannot be changed.

Refires: No Refires will be allowed for defective guns or ammunition or for any other malfunctions of the shooter's equipment. Competitor may clear jams or malfunctions provided all safety requirements are met.

Breaking Ties: Ties will be broken following PPC Rule Section 15.

Award Schedule: Firearms may be awarded to the top finishers in State Championship Grand Aggregate depending on the number of Firearms available. An award will be made to the Match Winner 1st and second Grand Aggregate. Awards will be made to 1st and 2nd in each Class provided their at least 5 competitors. Awards will also be made to the Match Winner of the sub matches and 1st in Class. If their less than 5 High Masters they will compete for match winner only.

Range Rules: All competitors will comply with posted range rules and directions from the range master. For reasons of safety cross draw and shoulder holster and holsters which require the insertion of the finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed.

Courses of Fire: The Range Officer will announce the course of fire, shooting positions and time prior to the start of each Match and Stage. Time will start with a loaded gun in holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun or holster until the command to commence firing is given.

All loading will be with cartridges taken from the competitor's pocket, cartridge belt, mechanical loaders, or special pouch. To force reloading under time restraints, magazine loading is limited to 6 rounds per magazine. There is no limit on the number of magazines you have but all used during the firing of a stage or string MUST be on your person. It is the competitors' responsibility to have sufficient ammunition in their possession to complete the Match being fired.

A conventional right or left-hand holster must be used. For safety reasons, shoulder, cross draw or holsters which require releasing by insertion of finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Holster cannot be tied down.

Optical Devices: No optical devices other than normal glasses worn for corrective eyesight or Sunglasses will be permitted on the range during Match firing for use by competitors. Use of a mechanical iris, eye patch or eye cover is also prohibited.

Firearms & Ammunition Allowed: Please see NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book Section 3 and the *PPC rule Book Quick View Matrix* reproduced below. If a competitor is uncertain about any equipment being eligible they must contact the Tournament Director or NRA Match Supervisor for a decision prior to firing the first Match.

APPLIES TO ALL FIREARMS

Rule 3.1

Each competitor is responsible for their firearm and any which may be questionable should be submitted to the Tournament Director, Referee, or 3-Man Jury for decision prior to being used.

All standard safety features of the pistol must operate properly.

With respect to Sections 3.2 through 3.10, and in addition to the firearm specific regulations below, the following features are either Allowed or Prohibited on all firearms.

Ammunition: No high speed or Magnum ammunition will be allowed. Ammunition must be hand loaded or factory loaded to produce sufficient velocity to pass through the target AND the backer. Shots which do not pass through the target and the backer will be scored as misses.

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, the following specifications apply for Production Pistols.		
Firearm / Caliber: Approved Pistols for this Division are listed in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14.1 on the Law Enforcement Competitions website. To be considered, must be a mass produced center-fire semi-automatic pistol made for police or military use (at least 1,000 pistols), unmodified stock catalog item in its original factory condition, and have a double, double/single, or striker type action. Must be capable of chambering and firing .35 caliber or larger ammunition, or FN 5.7 x 28 caliber ammunition. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action.

Trigger Pull Minimum: Single or Double Action	3.5 Pounds	
Sight Radius Maximum	7.5 Inches	
Installation of extended magazine releases and slide catches produced by the pistol's manufacturer.	Allowed

When you get your Production Distinguished scorecard **YOU** must record your competitor information, the information about the Production Pistol and Sights you want to use, the page number your pistol is listed on and its Approval Number in

NRA Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14-1.

Prior to shooting, your pistol **MUST** be **INSPECTED** and **TRIGGER PULL WEIGHED** to Certify your pistol as approved by a Tournament Official who will sign your scorecard.

Scorecards are later reviewed by NRA LE Competitions before your score is validated and recorded. Scorecards with missing information or not signed by a Tournament Official are not recorded so **YOU** need to make sure all sections on the scorecard are complete.

Please note that **YOU** must record your sight information on your NRA Production Distinguished Pistol Scorecard.

So if you have replaced the original sights make sure you know the name, model of the sight, the page number they are listed on, and their Approval Number as listed in

Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 16-1.

The NRA has made it clear that **NO** matter what **APPROVED** Replacement Sight is used, the sights **MUST** keep a Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact, **NOT** a competition set up, such as a Neck Hold, Shoulder Hold, or Head Hold.

A Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact sight set up requires the sights to be aligned on the X Ring/Center Mass to obtain a Hit in the X Ring/Center Mass area.

Pistols with competition sight set ups will be Disqualified, even if having already been used to fire a Match. Competitors may be required to allow their pistol to be test fired, or checked with a laser boresighter to check the sight set up.
