We will also be conducting a Practice Day so competitors can make sure their firearms are zeroed in for our elevation.

We will also be offering a Practice Day before the Tournament on Wednesday, September 18<sup>th</sup>.

**Governing Rules:** Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournament. All competitors are encouraged to review the current PPC rules. The NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book is available on-line at [ppc.nra.org](http://ppc.nra.org) or use your smart phone camera to scan this Quick Reader Code ~no special app or software is required. If viewing on your, Press the CTRL Key and click your cursor on it to go to the website.



**Individual Eligibility:** Open to any eligible law enforcement member as outlined in Police Pistol Combat Rule Section 2.4. These include active and retired Law Enforcement Officers, and full time Police Firearms Instructors, Transit Police, Penal Institution Guards, Industrial Police which includes Bank Guards and Armored and Express Company Guards, and Military Police. Federal Flight Deck Officers who hold valid certifications are also eligible.

NRA Membership is not required for any NRA competitions but is encouraged. A special law enforcement discount form for NRA Membership and Renewal will be available at check in.

**Schedule, Matches Offered, & Fees:**

- There is a Tournament Registration Fee of \$ 10.00 that applies to all competitors.
- The first Match each day starts promptly at 0800. Shooters are expected to be on the firing line and ready for tower instructions 10 minutes prior to the start time for each event. Please make sure to give yourself adequate time to get your gear together and be on-line when called. There are no refunds for missing an assigned relay.
- All subsequent Matches will begin when the Match before ends and any necessary Range Operations are completed.
- Matches will run straight through the day with no formal lunch break.

**Registration:** Advanced Registration is **highly recommended** and is the only means to assure you will be able to compete.

**To Register:** Complete the Registration Form on the last page and follow the submission instructions. You can Register on site for any openings that may be available beginning on Tuesday, September 17<sup>th</sup> in the Statistical Office.

All payments will be taken on site and **MUST be in CASH or by Government Agency Check.** Please help out by bringing exact change.

**Classification:** Competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications and new shooters with no Classification or those without a Temporary Record Score Book will fire in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2.

**Categories:** Categories will not be used at this Tournament.

**Team Matches & Eligibility:**

- Team Matches will be Unfired Paper Matches with Registration taking place on site.
- Teams will consist of two or four firing members and a Team Captain. The Team Captain may be a competing member of the team.
- Police Pistol Combat Rule 2.8 requires that all team members must be from the same agency. Membership can include officers retired from the agency if they are not now employed by another eligible agency.
- Eligible Military competitors who are also regular full time law enforcement, industrial law enforcement, or reserve/auxiliary law enforcement must sign up with other members from their law enforcement agency.
- No “pick-up” teams are allowed.
- Team Classifications will be done following PPC Rule 19.16
- Agencies MAY enter more than one Four Officer or Two Officer Team in each Team Match offered. However, team members may not be on a Four Officer and a Two Officer Team in the same in type Match. For instance, a competitor may not be a member of a Four Officer Open Class Revolver Team and a member of the agencies Two Officer Open Class Revolver Team.

**Check In:** Competitor Packets will be available for pick up **on Wednesday after 1000.**

Competitors will need to present their:

- Current or Retired Law Enforcement Credentials showing eligibility.
- Current Classification Card or current Temporary Classification Book unless you have not fired in a PPC Tournament before.

Once eligibility is determined, you will get your Competitor Packet which will have your Match and Relay Schedule.

**Squadding:** All matches will be squadded by the Statistical Office.

**Eye and Ear Protection:** Mandatory for all shooters !

**Shooting Mats/Ground Cloths:** The NPSC shooting mats will be used for this Tournament.

**Practice Day:** Practice Relays will be offered on Wednesday September 18<sup>th</sup> to allow competitors to zero their firearms for our elevation and lighting conditions and accustom shooters to the target and barricade system.

Start times are approximate and subject to change. All shooters are expected to be on the firing line and ready for tower instructions 10 minutes prior to the start time for each event. There will be no refunds for missing or being late for a Relay.

- Practice Relay Tickets are \$ 20.<sup>00</sup> and allow you to fire an unlimited number of relays.
- Tickets will only be sold on site and will be available for purchase until 1400.
- There are **NO** assigned target lanes.
- Shooters will be provided one B-27 Cardboard Target Backer and two Repair Centers per relay ticket to be used as they decide.
- Shooters **MUST BRING THEIR OWN STAPLE GUN** or Spray Glue for the Repair Centers
- The first Practice Relay will begin at 0900.
- The final Practice Relay information and start times will be posted on site.

**Awards Ceremony:** The awards ceremony will be held on Friday, approximately 1 ½ hours after the Preliminary Bulletin for the last Match goes Final.

#### **Award & Prize Schedule:**

- Tournament Prizes: Cash and merchandise prizes as donations and sponsorships allow.
- NRA Regional Trophies: The following NRA Police Pistol Combat Regional Trophies will be awarded.

  - Stock Service Revolver Match 7: First through Third Place

  - Distinguished Production Pistol Match 24: First through Third Place
  - Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Aggregate Match 13: First through Third Place
  - Open Class Revolver Aggregate Match 6: First through Third Place
  - NRA Regional Medallions will be sent out by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions after they receive the Tournament Report with any eligible scores.

**Targets:** Official NRA B-27 targets will be used.

**Scoring:** Competitor scoring will be utilized. This means that competitors are responsible for recording all shots and tallying the total scores. Pursuant to PPC Rule 14.2, **NO** competitor will score their own target **NOR** may a competitor score the targets of a competitor from their same agency. If this cannot be avoided due to the Relay's makeup contact a Match Official to score the targets.



Please remember that PPC Rules prohibit the use of plug-type scoring gauges. Overlays and Eagle Eyes may be used by competitors.

It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that their scorecards are completed, signed and turned into the collecting Match Official. Once the scorecard is signed, the value of shots recorded on the card is final and cannot be changed.

**Challenges:** A Challenge fee of \$3.00 will be charged for each shot challenged. See NRA Rule Section 16.1 for correct procedure. Challenges of Preliminary Bulletin scores must be made within one hour of posting time. Once a Bulletin goes Final, scores cannot be changed event if there was an error.

**Breaking of Ties:** As per NRA PPC Rule Section 15.

**Refires:** Competitors will not be allowed to re-fire because of a defective gun, ammunition or other equipment malfunctions. Please refer to PPC Rule 9.10 for specifics. Competitors may clear jams or malfunctions provided safety rules and conditions are adhered.

**Result Bulletins:** Final Result Bulletins will be provided to each competitor.

**Courses of Fire:** The Range Officer will announce the course of fire, shooting positions and time prior to the start of each Match and Stage. Time will start with a loaded gun in holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun or holster until the command to commence firing is given.

All loading will be with cartridges taken from the competitor's pocket, cartridge belt, mechanical loaders, or special pouch. To force reloading under time restraints, magazine loading is limited to 6 rounds per magazine. There is no limit on the number of magazines you have but all used during the firing of a stage or string **MUST** be on your person. It is the competitors' responsibility to have sufficient ammunition in their possession to complete the Match being fired.

A conventional right or left-hand holster must be used. For safety reasons, shoulder, cross draw or holsters which require releasing by insertion of finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Holster cannot be tied down.

Optical Devices: No optical devices other than normal glasses worn for corrective eyesight or Sunglasses will be permitted on the range during Match firing for use by competitors. Use of a mechanical iris, eye patch or eye cover is also prohibited.

**Firearms & Ammunition Allowed:** Please see NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book Section 3 and the *PPC rule Book Quick View Matrix* reproduced below. If a competitor is uncertain about any equipment being eligible they must contact the Tournament Director or NRA Match Supervisor for a decision prior to firing the first Match.

<b>APPLIES TO ALL FIREARMS</b>		Rule 3.1
Each competitor is responsible for their firearm and any which may be questionable should be submitted to the Tournament Director, Referee, or 3-Man Jury for decision prior to being used. All standard safety features of the pistol must operate properly. With respect to Sections 3.2 through 3.10, and in addition to the firearm specific regulations below, the following features are either Allowed or Prohibited on all firearms.

Must be capable of chambering and firing .35 caliber or larger ammunition, or FN 5.7 x 28 caliber ammunition. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action.

PRODUCTION DUTY OPTIC PISTOL		Rule 3.10.1
In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, and 3.10, the following specifications apply for Production Duty Optic Pistols.		
Firearm / Caliber: Pistols meeting the specifications for Production Pistols in Section 3.10 and are listed as <b>Approved in Police Pistol Combat Bulletin 14.1</b> may be equipped with an Approved non-magnified optic suitable for duty use.		
<b>The Duty Optic must be listed as Approved by NRA Law Enforcement Competitions in Police Pistol Combat Bullet 19.1</b> on the Law Enforcement Competitions website.		
To be considered for approval, Duty Optics must mount <u>without any modification</u> to the handgun as originally manufactured. Swapping the original slide to an aftermarket slide with optic mount cuts is <u>not</u> allowed since the handgun is no longer as originally manufactured.		
The pistol should have co-witnessed front and rear sights, but the rear sight may be removed to mount the Duty Optic or to use a stock Optic Ready Plate.		
All Other Specifications are the same as Production Pistols		

**YOU must record your competitor information, Production Pistol information on your NRA Production Distinguished scorecard. This includes the page number your pistol is listed on and its Approval Number in PPC Bulletin 14-1.**

**Prior to shooting, your pistol MUST be INSPECTED and TRIGGER PULL WEIGHED to Certify it is approved by a NRA REFEREE who will sign your scorecard.**

**YOU must also record your Sight information on your NRA Production Distinguished Pistol Scorecard. So if you have replaced the original sights make sure you know the name, model of the sight, the page number they are listed on, and their Approval Number as listed in PPC Bulletin 16-1.**

**The NRA has made it clear that NO matter what APPROVED Replacement Sight is used, the sights MUST keep a Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact, NOT a competition set up, such as a Neck Hold, Shoulder Hold, or Head Hold.**

**A Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact sight set up requires the sights to be aligned on the X Ring/Center Mass to obtain a Hit in the X Ring/Center Mass area.**

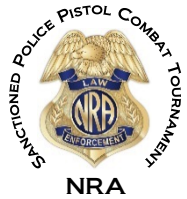
