Rules: NRA 2025 Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournament.

The Rule Book is available on-line at **ppc.nra.org**. or by scanning the Quick

Reader Code with your phone camera.

Eligibility: Open to any individual police member of the N.R.A. or C.P.C.A. eligible to

compete under rule 2.4 of the current NRA PPC Rule Book. Civilian members are also eligible to compete and must be sponsored by a law enforce member. Individuals may join the NRA and the Washington State Police Pistol Association

(WSPPA) during Tournament registration.

NRA Membership is not required however competitors may join the NRA by

contacting the WSPPA Secretary to receive the reduced Law Enforcement rate. Law Enforcement Competitors may become a member of the Washington State Police Pistol Association (WSPPA) and must be a member by the last Match in April to be eligible for the Washington Governor's 20. Civilian Competitors are not eligible for

the Governors 20 and do not have to join the WSPPA.

Shooting Time: All shooters are reminded that shooting will begin at 10:00 a.m. and all wishing to

compete must be registered prior to that time. Registration closes at 10:00 a.m.

Registration: Registration will begin at 9:00 a.m. or upon arrival of the Tournament Director.

Fees: 1st Open Class Match 600/1500 (Revolver) \$ 20

2nd Open Class Match 600/1500 (Semi-Auto)\$ 15Off Duty Match - Revolver or Semi-Auto\$ 5Stock Service Match - Revolver or Semi-Auto\$ 5

Match Firing Order: The first Match of the day will be the Stock Service/Duty Gun Matches for Off

Duty and Stock Service firearms followed by the Open Class 600/1500 Revolver and then the Open Class 600/1500 Semi-Auto Match. If fired, Open Class 1500

will include participation in Open Class 600 only (Match 5 or 12).

Ammunition:

You can see the Ammunition specifications for each firearm type in the Arms Allowed specification tables on Page 3. No magnum or high-speed ammunition

will be allowed.

The following quantities of ammunition will be required for each Match:

600/1500 Revolver 60 or 150 rounds 600/1500 Semi-Auto 60 or 150 rounds

Off-Duty Revolver/Semi-Auto 48 rounds Stock Service Revolver/Semi-Auto 48 rounds

Squadding:

All Matches will be squadded with each individual assigned a relay and target position. Squadding tickets for individual Matches will be issued from the statistical office at the time of registration. Competitors must pick up these tickets as soon as they arrive at the range.

NRA membership cards and classification cards must be exhibited before Squadding tickets will be issued. A competitor who fails to obtain his Squadding ticket or to present him/herself at a proper firing point when his relay is called may

lose the right to compete in that event.

Classification: Competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification

> of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications and new shooters with no Classification or those without a

Temporary Record Score Book will fire in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2. Competitors may check their current NRA Classification at LEcompetitions.nra.org. or by scanning the Quick Reader Code with their

phone camera.

Categories: There will be no categories used for this Tournament.

An Award will be given to Match winner and 1st Place in each Classification. Awards:

> Additional Awards for each five shooters will be given in each Class. If there are less than 5 competitors in any one Class, they may be moved up to the next higher Class for the purpose of Awards. Awards will be given for Match 5, 14, and 15.

Any questions concerning firearms, ammunition or holsters should be directed to Tournament Director prior to commencement of that shooter's relay. Where applicable, triggers will be weighed, and ammo inspected prior to Match.

#### **APPLIES TO ALL FIREARMS**

Rule 3.1

Each competitor is responsible for their firearm and any which may be questionable should be submitted to the Tournament Director, Referee, or 3-Man Jury for decision prior to being used.

All standard safety features of the pistol must operate properly.

With respect to Sections 3.2 through 3.10, and in addition to the firearm specific regulations below, the following features are either Allowed or Prohibited on all firearms.

Trombiced on all medimor		
Action work to make a crisper and/or smoother trigger pull.	Allowed	
Fixed or adjustable sights.	Allowed	
Sight Blackening.	Allowed	
Modification or change of stocks because of the size of a competitor's hand or to facilitate loading.	Allowed	
Internal modifications that would render the firearm less safe than originally designed by the manufacturer.	Prohibited	
Any external modifications, except those allowed within each rule.	Prohibited	
Front sight extending beyond muzzle.	Prohibited	
Compensators, barrel venting, or barrel porting.	Prohibited	
Ammunition: No high speed or Magnum		

Ammunition: No high speed or Magnum ammunition will be allowed. Ammunition must be hand loaded or factory loaded to produce sufficient velocity to pass through the target AND the backer. Shots which do not pass through the target and the backer will be scored as misses.

#### OPEN CLASS SEMI-AUTOMATIC PISTOLS

In addition to the specifications within Section 3.1, the following specifications apply for Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistols.

Firearm / Caliber: Center-fire pistols of .35 caliber or larger. All double action semi-automatic pistols must fire the first shot of every stage double action except at the 50 yard line.

Caliber / Ammunition: Either hand loaded or factory loaded ammunition may be used. Wadcutter ammunition is allowed.

Firearm / Caliber: A factory manufactured (catalog item) revolver with duty sights capable of chambering and firing .38 Special ammunition.

Firing Method: D.A. will designate Matches which must be fired Double Action. S.A. will

designate Matches which may be fired either Double or Single Action.

Loading: After initial loading, all loading will be with cartridges taken from the

competitor's pocket, cartridge belt, mechanical loaders, or special pouch which

must be on the competitor's person. See PPC Rule 10.14.

All loading will be with six (6) cartridges. Time for reloading is included in the time for each Match or stage. For additional loading procedures see PPC Rule 10.14.

Time: Time will be announced for each stage or Match. Time will start with loaded gun

in the holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun until the

command to commence firing is given.

Optical Devices: No optical devices (other than normal glasses worn for corrective eyesight

purposes or sun glasses) will be permitted on the range during firing for use by competitors or team officials. Optical devices have also been interpreted to

prohibit the use of mechanical iris, and eye patch or eye cover.

Holster: A conventional right or left-handed holster must be used. For safety reasons,

shoulder, cross draw or holsters which require releasing by insertion of finger

within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Holster cannot be tied down.

Targets: NRA B-27 target will be used. Hits on the 7, 8, 9, 10 and X scoring areas will

only be used.

Sighting Shots: Sighting shots will not be allowed on the day of the Tournament prior to, or during

the Tournament.

Refires: No refires will be allowed for defective guns or ammunition or for other malfunction

of the shooter's equipment. Competitors may clear jams or malfunctions provided all

safety requirements are met.

Breaking Ties: See Rule 15.3 for tie breaking procedures.

Range Safety: The Range Safety Rules are posted at the entrance to the range and will be followed

by all competitors and observers.

Time of Firing: Firing will commence at 10:00 a.m.

Courses of Fire: Open Class Division Matches - See PPC Rule Book Section 7 for full details.

Open Class 1500 Revolvers: Match 1 through 5

Open Class 1500 Semi-Automatic Pistols: Match 8 through 12

• Open Class 600 consists of Match 5 or 12 only.

Open Class Revolver Match 1 / Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 8 / 24 Rounds

Stage 1: 7 yards, 12 shots, one or two hands, fired double action standing without support in 20

seconds.

Stage 2: 15 yards, 12 shots, one or two hands, fired double action standing without support in 20

seconds.

Open Class Revolver Match 2 / Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 9 / 18 Rounds

At 25 yards, 6 shots kneeling; 6 shots standing left hand with support from behind barricade, 6 shots standing right hand with support from behind barricade, all fired double action, in 90 seconds.

#### Targets will be Scored after firing the above 42 rounds.

Open Class Revolver Match 3 / Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 10 / 24 Rounds

At 50 yards, 6 shots sitting; 6 shots prone; 6 shots standing left hand with support from behind barricade; 6 shots standing right hand with support from behind barricade in 2 minutes and 45 seconds. All shots may be fired single or double action.

Open Class Revolver Match 4 / Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 11 / 24 Rounds

Two stages of 12 shots from 25 yards each fired double action, standing without support in 35 seconds for each 12-shot stage.

Targets will be Scored after firing the above 48 rounds.

#### Open Class Revolver Match 5 / Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 12 / 60 Rounds

#### National Police Course

The National Police Course is an aggregate of the following 4 stages.

- Stage 1: 7 yards, 12 shots one or two hands, double action standing without support in 20 seconds.
- Stage 2: 25 yards, 6 shots kneeling without support; 6 shots standing left hand with support from behind barricade, 6 shots standing right hand with support from behind barricade, all fired double action in 90 seconds.

#### Targets will be Scored after firing the above 30 rounds.

- Stage 3: 50 yards, 6 shots sitting; 6 shots prone; 6 shots standing left hand with support from behind barricade; 6 shots standing right hand with support from behind barricade, all shots may be fired single or double action in 2 minutes and 45 seconds.
- Stage 4: 25 yards, 6 shots one or two hands double action standing without support in 12 seconds.

#### Targets will be Scored after firing the above 30 rounds.

Courses of Fire:

NRA Duty Gun Division Course - See PPC Rule Book Section 7 for full details. Each Match is 48 Rounds.

- Stock Service Revolver Match 7
- Stock Service Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 14
- Off Duty Revolver Match 15R
- Off Duty Semi-automatic Pistol Match 15S
- Stage 1: 3 yards, 6 shots one hand double action standing without support in 8 seconds.
- Stage 2: 7 yards, 12 shots one or two hands double action standing without support in 20 seconds.
- Stage 3: 15 yards, 12 shots one or two hands double action standing without support in 20 seconds.
- Stage 4: 25 yards, 18 shots one or two hands double action 6 shots kneeling, from behind the Barricade with support; 6 shots standing left hand from behind the Barricade with support; and 6 shots standing right hand from behind the Barricade with support in 90 seconds. The Barricade MUST be used for cover & support.
