Governing Rules: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rules will govern throughout the Tournament. All competitors are encouraged to review the current PPC rules. The NRA Polic Pistol Combat Rule Book is available on-line at **ppc.nra.org.** or use your smart phone camera scan the Quick Reader Code.



Eligibility: Open to any individual police member of the NRA or C.P.C.A. eligible to compete under PPC Rule Section 2 of the current NRA Police Pistol Combat Rule Book. Individuals may join the NRA and the Washington State Police Pistol Association (WSPPA) during match registration.

First Time Shooters: You do NOT need any fancy gear or guns to start shooting these matches. Just bring your duty handgun, four magazines, holster & magazine pouch. There is nothing to memorize, the course will be announced as you shoot just like the stages during a qualification and fellow officers will gladly help you out. You can even use your stock duty gun to fire the Open Class Division matches to get started and see how challenging and fun these matches are.

NRA Membership: Membership is not required however competitors may join the NRA on-site. Competitors may become a member of the Washington State Police Pistol Association (WSPPA) and must be a member by the first match in April to be eligible for the Washington Governor's 20.

Registration: Registration will be conducted on-site from 0800 to 0900. Please complete the Registration Form at the end of this announcement and bring it with you to speed your registration process.

CLASSIFICATION: Competitors will be entered using their current NRA Police Pistol Combat Classification of High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman, or Classified. Competitors with expired Classifications and **new shooters** with no Classification or those without a Temporary Record Score Book will fire in the High Master Class as required by PPC Rule 19.2. Competitors may check their current NRA Classification at <u>LEcompetitions.nra.org</u>. or use your smart phone camera to scan the Quick Reader Code to the right.



Categories: No categories will be used for these tournaments.



Range Safety: The Range Safety Rules are posted at the entrance to the range and will be followed by all competitors and observers.

• Second NRA Open Class Match (<i>Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 12</i>) The intent of the Second Open Class Match is to allow shooters to fire both their Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol and their Open Class Revolver. Shooters MAY register and pay to fire the same Open Class Handgun twice. However, following PPC Rule 1.7.7, ONLY the first match you fire will be forwarded to the NRA as a Score for Record, be recorded in the Official Tournament Bulletin Standings and eligible for Awards purposes. In other words, the first score will be for Score and second with the same handgun will be for fun and practice.	\$ 1	12.00

Awards: Gift certificates or cash will be given to the Match Winner and First Place in each Classification. Additional awards may be presented if funds are available. Classes with only one competitor may be moved to the next higher Class for award purposes. Awards will be given for NRA Matches 5, 7, 12, 14, 15 and 23.

Match Order: All shooters **MUST** be Registered prior to 0900 when the first match of the day will begin. The Match/Relay firing order will be the Open Class Revolver Match 5 and then Open Class Semi-Automatic Pistol Match 12. The order of the all other Matches will be determined by the greatest number of competitors entered in each match.

Squadding: All matches will be squadded. Squadding Tickets for Individual Matches will be issued by the Statistical Office at the time of Registration. Competitors must pick-up these tickets as soon as they arrive at the range.

NRA Membership cards, Classification Cards or Temporary Score Record Books must be exhibited before Squadding Tickets will be issued. A competitor who fails to obtain their Squadding Ticket or to present themselves at a proper firing point when their relay is called may lose the right to compete in that event.

Targets: Official NRA B-27 targets will be used.

Scoring: Competitor scoring will be used. Pursuant to PPC Rule 14.2, **NO** competitor will score their own target **NOR** may a competitor score the targets of a competitor from their same agency. If this cannot be avoided due to the Relay's makeup contact a Match Official to score the targets. PPC Rules prohibit the use of plug-type scoring gauges. Overlays and Eagle Eyes may be used by competitors.

Score cards must be signed and are FINAL once signed so **PLEASE** double check the recorded hits and values BEFORE signing.

Course of Fire Information:

Loading: To force reloading under time restraints and magazines are loaded with a maximum of 6 rounds. After initial loading, all loading will be with cartridges taken from the competitor's pocket, cartridge belt, mechanical loaders, or special pouch which must be on the competitor's person. PPC Rule 10.14.

Time Limits: Time Limits will be announced for each stage or match. Time will start with loaded gun in the holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun until the command to commence firing is given.

Holster: A conventional right or left-handed holster must be used. For safety reasons, shoulder, cross draw or holsters which require releasing by insertion of finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Holster cannot be tied down.

Optical Devices: No optical devices other than normal glasses worn for corrective eyesight purposes or sun glasses are permitted on the range during firing for use by competitors. Optical devices include use of mechanical irises, eye patches and eye covers.

NO matter what APPROVED Replacement Sight is used, the sights MUST keep a Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact, not a competition set up, such as a Neck Hold, Shoulder Hold, or Head Hold.

A Duty Gun Point of Aim/Point of Impact sight set up requires the sights to be aligned on the X Ring/Center Mass to obtain a Hit in the X Ring/Center Mass area.

Pistols with competition sight set ups will be Disqualified, even if having already been used to fire a Match. Competitors may be required to allow their pistol to be test fired, or checked with a laser boresight to check the sight set up.
